Wellbeing Support through Wirral Kooth Secondary School Engagement Programme

This half term all year groups have had presentations from Kooth.

Kooth.com is a free, safe and anonymous online counselling and mental health support service.

Kooth has been commissioned in The Wirral by The Cheshire & Merseyside ICB for any young person between the ages of 11 and 25.

In these assemblies Kooth representatives have highlighted and modelled the range of support features available on Kooth, including how to sign up and access counselling support.

PSHE

In recent sessions all our students have learned how and when to perform CPR and also where the Defibrillator points in the school are. We believe this is a crucial piece of knowledge that all young people should have so please ask your child to share their experiences with you.

Pupils in Year 7 have been developing their knowledge on healthy and unhealthy relationships. They have also been learning about Consent and the Law around this issue.





Pupils in Year 8 and 9 have been learning about the world of work and how it has changed since the Pandemic.

They have also been looking at jobs of the future specifically in Wirral and the skills and attributes required for these jobs.

Pupils in Year 10 and 11 have been focusing on financial capability. Lessons have been focused on how to avoid getting into debt and debt management alongside lessons on how to create a budget.
