

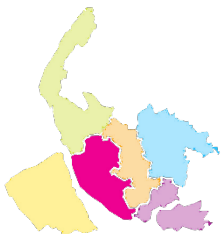
HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW LIVERPOOL? (AND APPRENTICESHIPS) THE ANSWERS, IN BOLD

1. What is the population of Liverpool?
a) 179,000 b) 274,000 c) **491, 500**

274,000 is the population of Sefton and 179,000 is the population of St Helens
2. What's the average annual wage in Liverpool?
a) £26,173 b) **£27,157** c) £28, 213

£26, 173 is the average annual wage in the NW (LCR, Greater Manchester, Cheshire and Warrington, Lancashire and Cumbria) and £28,213 is the average annual wage for the UK
3. Where do more people work – in **Human Health and Social Care** (looking after people) or in Wholesale and Retail (Selling things)?

43,000 work in Human Health and Social Care (the biggest employment sector in the city) and 34,000 work in retail. *What effect do the class think internet shopping is likely to have on the numbers employed in retail in the future?*
4. Tourism is worth £3bn a year to Liverpool. **True** or False. In 2017 the figure was £2.9bn and since then the city has continued to see hotels being opened
5. How many people visited Liverpool in 2017?
a) 20m b) 26m c) **34m** (the figure is actually 34.8m i.e. the total number who visited for a day or longer period)
6. How many films have been totally or partially shot in Liverpool since 2000?
a) 36 b) 42 c) **53** including Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, Fast and Furious and Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them. 7. Does Liverpool have **more** or less than 15,000 businesses? 15,180
8. Are there more people employed in Liverpool than in Cardiff, Nottingham and Newcastle? **Yes** or no. 241,000 employees in Liverpool, 207,700 in Cardiff, 219,200 in Nottingham and 178, 400 but these cities have smaller populations than Liverpool. Bristol a city with a similar population to Liverpool has 259,000 employees.
9. Liverpool is an UNESCO World Heritage Site just like the Taj Mahal and Great Wall of China. **True** or False. The World Heritage site expands along the waterfront from the Royal Albert Dock to the Stanley Dock in the North and through the commercial district and Ropewalks area up to St George's Hall



10. You must be 16-24 to start an apprenticeship?

True or **False** – you can be any age. The oldest apprentice in the UK is 67 (employed by the Co-op)

11. Apprenticeships are for people who don't do well at school?

True or **False**. They are just another route into employment and an alternative to university
