Case study 1

This term some time has been allocated to support the potential NEET cohort.

Approx 34 students were allocated a careers guidance interview with the flexibility to spend as much time that was needed to explore career plans and move students forward. To date 19 students have been seen with 14 now having made applications. 8 students are not attending school so visits will be arranged in the Spring Term.

More time will be allocated to supporting these students in the Spring term.

Case study 2

Working with challenging students can sometimes be difficult particularly when they are disengaged from school subjects. I have met one particular student on several

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occasions. Initially the student only wanted to see me for a CV but after some discussion and several informal interviews she was willing to see me to support her to complete her application to College. She is aware that I am available to see in school at any time.

Actions picked up from the previous termly report

• Continue to provide one to one guidance for pupils.

Priorities and areas for development for the next term

- To develop and deliver some A level choices sessions outlining to student s how they can select A levels alongside some labour market information.
- Support school in the delivery of their careers programme including year 11 options day and Mock interview preparation.

Positive activities this term

- Working alongside the AEN team and meeting parents has been really positive this year with most students having made their applications.
- Having some flexibility in terms of day to day organisation of interviews has also been useful as some students have benefitted from longer interviews slots especially during application sessions.
